

With the assistance of the Board and Committee chairs—we are going to have a fantastic year...



A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.



Areas where vessels must be fully off plane and completely settled in the water. Any wake created by a vessel in one of these zones must be minimal (very small). If your vessel is traveling with the bow even slightly elevated while in one of these zones, it is not proceeding at "Slow Speed" as required by law. <https://www.boat-ed.com/florida/handbook/page/28/Boating-Regulatory-Zones/>

I wish you all a very Happy and Healthy 2019!







Leaving a Legacy to GHYC is a way members can leave a gift to the club in remembrance of good friends and great times they have enjoyed here.






